It is a tremendous honor to have been nominated and to be considered for the position of Vice President of the Eastern Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (EASFAA). After more than 20 years in higher education, I can say with confidence our professional associations, including EASFAA, bring administrators together to solve major problems and to provide spaces for supporting each other through the implementation of those solutions. Prior to moving to the Eastern Region, I served in multiple capacities culminating as President of the Missouri Association of Student Financial Aid Personnel and in multiple positions on the board of the Midwest Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators. I'm also involved in NASFAA – this June I'll end my tenure as the NASFAA National Conference Task Force Chair.
